
epitomises the values and ethos of our school.

Year 6 Visit to the Cambourne Archaeology Project

Following the visit of the archaeologists from Oxford Archaeology last week, Year 6 visited the excavations to see some real life archaeology in action for themselves. After receiving a guided tour of the excavations by ex-Monkfield Park pupils, who are members of the Cambourne Village College Archaeology Club, who had recently discovered a very exciting cess pit, the children were



thrilled to have the opportunity to do some digging for themselves. Using trowels and sieves the children carefully pulled back the layers of earth to reveal sherds of pottery, flints and animal bones—vital pieces of evidence which tell the story of the people
