We hope the children have an enjoyable half term break and will return to school full of enthusiasm for our new topics in the next half term. Homework

We have been very impressed with the level of creativity and dedication to the homework grid over the last term. English and Maths will be set every Monday and it is to be returned by the following Monday. Homework grids for this half term will be stuck in the homework books and the children are able to choose from a range of activities from the grids.

Spellings will be set on Monday each week and will be tested on Friday. We will include a spelling sheet with homework which will have their spelling words along with ideas for how to practise learning them. Reading continues to be a big focus for the school. The requirement is that the children read every day. Their reading records and reading books need to be in school every day and will be checked regularly.

Timings for completing homework area as follows:

Daily	Reading	10 minutes
Daily	Spelling	10 minutes
Weekly	English	20-30 minutes
Weekly	Maths	20-30 minutes

If your child has any problems with any part of their homework, they have been told to come to discuss the task with us before Thursday. If the homework is not completed to a good standard then it may need to be repeated. Please feel free to write comments in your child's book as to how you feel they coped with the tasks.

Helping at home:

- Check homework books and support your child in completing their homework.
- Regularly read with your child and discuss what they have read; completing the reading log.
- Test your child on their spellings and play word games using their spelling words.
- Practise counting forwards and backwards in different steps from any number.
- Practise telling the time.
- Give opportunities to use money, including calculating change.
- Practise times table facts and related division facts (up to 12 x 12).

PE

Children must have their correct PE kit in school at all times. To avoid unnecessary disruption to the curriculum please ensure that your child brings their PE kit to school on Monday and that it is taken home to be washed on Friday. Children will need both indoor kit (blue shorts and a white T shirt) and outdoor kit (warm jogging bottoms, a warm sweatshirt and sensible, supportive training shoes) at all times throughout the term as outdoor games will take place each week. Children will only be excused from PE on medical grounds if we receive a letter from the parent/carer. Please note that earrings must be removed for PE.
