### **A Healthy School**

A good school food culture helps children develop healthy eating habits so they can live healthier, longer lives and avoid tooth decay. At Monkfield Park we pride ourselves on promoting healthy eating habits. We have clear guidelines about the types of snacks children are allowed to bring to school. These are limited to any variety of raw fruit and vegetables for break time snacks. Children are **not allowed** to bring crisps, fizzy or sugary drink, chocolate, sweets, cereal bars (many are high in sugar and fat), pastries or biscuits. We also ask that if your child is having packed meals at lunchtime that you consider the contents of the lunchbox to ensure it is healthy and balanced. A useful leaflet is available from the school office if you would like some ideas of healthy options to include in lunch boxes.
