

#### **Book Your Lunch**

Please could we politely remind you to book your child's school lunches for the next half term? Booking in advance helps to avoid children becoming upset when they may not be able to have the full choice of meals if you haven't pre-booked. The kitchen staff always try to accommodate everyone but ordering in advance helps everyone.



#### Nut Oil in Sunscreen

As the weather becomes warmer and the sun becomes stronger, it is advisable to send children to school with a suitable sun hat and sun screen.

It has come to our attention that Nivea Kids Protect and Care Coloured Spray SPF 50+ has been reformulated and now contains almond oil as an active ingredient. We have a number of children in school who have a severe allergy to nuts and coming into contact with substances that contain nut oils, including almond oil, can induce a severe allergic reaction resulting in anaphylactic shock.

#### **Home Injuries**


