Online Safety—Squid Games

We have had to speak to the children in school this week as a number of them have been playing their own version of the Netflix TV Show, Squid Games.

The children's games have been very aggressive and violent in nature, as they have been playing a game called 'Red Light, Green Light', recreating the challenges included in the show and simulating injuring others and using punishments and unacceptable language.

The British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) has awarded Squid Game a 15 rating in the UK for "sexual violence references, injury detail, sexual images and violence". As such it is unsuitable viewing for children under the age of 15.

We have banned children from playing games based on this TV programme, in school. We urge parents and carers to make sure their children are not viewing this programme and to be wary of Squid Gamerelated content shared on social media sites such as TikTok.

What should parents do?

- It might be tempting to, but don't directly raise Squid Game with your child they might be unaware of it, and mentioning it could make them more likely to seek it out.
- Do let your child know they can talk to you about anything they see online that they find upsetting. If you hear them talking about Squid Game or if they mention it to you, talk to them about how the show isn't meant for young children.

We would encourage you to take this opportunity to check your Netflix settings for your child's profile. You can set maturity ratings so that your child only sees TV shows and films that have a rating suitable for their age.

To do this:

- 1. From a web browser, go to your account page
- 2. Open the 'Profile and Parental Controls' settings for the profile you want to manage
- 3. Change the 'Viewing Restrictions' setting
- 4. Enter your Netflix password
- 5. Set the maturity rating level for the TV shows and films you want to allow in that profile
- 6. Select 'Save'

Holidays In Term Time

We have seen a significant increase in applications to take holidays in term time.

If your child is registered at a school, by law they must attend that school regularly and punctually. Your child should only miss school if they are ill or unable to attend for some other unavoidable reason, including self-isolation as a consequence of COVID. The Education regulations state that headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. We recognise that the pandemic has had a significant impact on families however, it is vitally important that children are attending school regularly to prevent them falling behind.

If parents take their child on holiday or leave in term time, this will be counted as an unauthorised absence. This is the same as truancy and you may be at risk of a penalty notice fine being issued. There are only 190 statutory school days in one year and 175 days (weekends and school holidays) available to use for holidays or leave.
