English

- Planning for writing
- Perfecting our cursive handwriting style
- Using dictionaries to support our spellings
- Using simple organisational devices such as headings and subheadings.
- Using punctuation to show direct speech.

History

We will journey through a million years of prehistory as we explore the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age to discover how humans first came to Britain, how they lived and what progress was made during each era. It is packed full of information, facts and questions to challenge our historical enquiry skills.

PSHE

This anti-bullying unit will develop children's understanding of the key characteristics of bullying and they will learn about different forms of bullying.

Homework

Homework in KS2 should be manageable and is always linked to skills previously taught in the classroom. Timings for completing homework area as follows:

Daily Reading 10 minutes
Daily Spelling 10 minutes
Weekly Literacy/Topic 20-30 minutes
Weekly Maths 20-30 minutes

Homework is set and should be submitted via Seesaw. Individual logins can be found in the homework books. We use a topic grid to give the children a chance to pick an activity they will enjoy taking part in alongside the benefits of regular reading, spelling and maths based practice. If your child has any problems with any part of their homework, they have been told to come to discuss the task with us before Thursday and if the homework is not completed to a good standard then it may need to be repeated. IPads are available at the start of each day for children who need to use these for uploading their work in school. Please feel free to write comments on your child's Seesaw account as to how you feel they coped with the tasks.

Spellings

Spellings will be set on Monday each week and will be tested on Friday. Our aim is to see the children using the spellings that we set in their written work with increased accuracy throughout the term. These spelling are set on ReadiWriter and a paper copy will also be available for those that ask for it.

Ways in which you can help your child:

- * Check Seesaw/homework books and support your child in completing their homework
- * Regularly read with your child and discuss what they have read (we can provide suggestions on how to question if requested)
- * Test your child on their spellings and play word games using their spelling words
- * Practise counting forwards and backwards in different steps from any number (this is particularly relevant in Year 3)
- * Give opportunities to use money, including calculating change
- * Practise times table facts and related division facts (focus on x2, x5, x10, x3, x4 and x8)

<u>PE</u>
