Help to keep our school healthy—Cut back fat

We all know that too much fat is bad for us. But it's not always easy to tell where it's lurking. Here are a few fat-busting tips:

- Cut down on snack foods as they're often jam-packed with fat. Try and keep foods like crisps, buns, cakes, pastries and biscuits as occasional treats only.

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Monkfield Park Care & Learning Centre Holiday Club

The Care & Learning Centre operates a Holiday Club during school holiday periods.

Holiday Club sessions are charged by the hour from 8.00 am until 6.00 pm daily which enables parents/carers to book hours to suit their needs (the minimum chargeable unit is one hour).

Breakfast is available from 8.00 am until 10.00 am daily. Children arriving between these times independently choose activities to participate in. The children eat together between midday and 1.00 pm and an afternoon snack is served between 3.00 pm and 3.30 pm.

Children attending for full days or over lunchtime will need to bring a nut-free packed lunch. Also, we cannot heat or re-heat items sent in from home.

The current cost of Holiday Club is £4.70 per child per hour for children aged 3 to 11 years and £5.25 per hour for children aged from 2 until the term after their third birthday (a one-off registration fee of £30.00 applies to register a child at the Care & Learning Centre).
