Monkfield Park Awarded Primary Science Quality Mark

It has been a double celebration this week as we have been notified that Monkfield Park has been awarded the gilt level **Primary Science Quality Mark.** In September **Primary Science Quality Marks** have been awarded



to 230 infant, junior, primary, middle and special schools to celebrate a commitment to excellence in science teaching and learning. Needless to say, we are delighted with this achievement that has been led by Mrs Wellings and Miss Simpson. The **Primary Science Quality Mark** (PSQM) is the only national award scheme to develop and celebrate the quality of science teaching and learning in primary schools. The Primary School Quality Mark scheme enables schools to work together to share good practice and is supported by professional development led by local experts. It encourages teacher autonomy and innovation while at the same time offering a clear framework for development in science subject leadership, teaching and learning.

Jane Turner, PSQM National Director said: "Gaining a Primary Science Quality Award is a significant achievement for a school. The profile and quality of science teaching and learning in each awarded school is very high. Children are engaging with great science both in and outside the classroom, developing positive attitudes towards science as well as secure scientific understanding and skills. Science subject leaders, their colleagues, head teachers, children, parents and governors should be very proud."

We are privileged to have so many budding scientists in our school and the staff have all worked very hard in fostering such a love in this area, so we are pleased to celebrate this special award with our families and children.


Year 1 love learning!
