# **Developing Resilient Children**— Find Some Headspace

In the second of our advisory pieces to families about developing resilience in children please find below some information about 'finding some headspace'.

Being able to manage emotional states is a key part of resilience. We often fail to act because our emotional reaction can trigger our 'fight or flight' response. One of the best activities you can use to create this distance between emotion and action is meditation.

It might sound new-age, but studies show that meditation can help the brain to be less reactive to this 'fight or flight' response and can help to improve attention and concentration.

Meditation can also help us to manage our stress and our anxiety, it helps to induce a state of calm, from which we can behave resiliently, without fear.
