WHAT'S NEW AT MONKFIELD PARK CARE AND

We are always looking for ways to improve at the Care and Learning Centre and are pleased to be able to tell you about recent changes that we have made and are continuing to work on:

- Themes we have revisited the themes for learning in the Care and Learning Centre to better reflect what the children enjoy learning about and are enthused about. This half term the children are learning about 'animals'. We look forward to sharing their learning and achievements with you.
- Planning and provision we have adapted our planning in each room to ensure that it mirrors what the children need to do next to help them learn. We are focussing particularly upon providing engaging table top activities that allow us to extend children's thinking and understanding through careful questioning.
- Flooring we are hoping to use some of our budget to replace all
 of the indoor flooring in the Care and Learning Centre rooms.

Watch this space for further developments to look forward to.

General Information

We have now welcomed our new children and their families to our setting. We hope your child is enjoying their time with us. If someone unexpected comes to collect your child we will ring you using the contact numbers provided to authorise the pick up. Please note that we do not allow anyone under sixteen years of age to collect children from the Care and Learning Centre pre-school.

Outdoor Play



Remember that we play outside everyday-whatever the weather. Please send your child with suitable clothing for outdoor play. Our mud kitchens are always popular and children's clothes may get dirty, so we ask that you send your child in clothes they are comfortable in and won't be worried if they get them dirty.

A bag of named spare clothes can be kept on your child's peg.



















Change of Details



Children's Work

The children work very hard creating mark-making and producing drawings and paintings for their parents and family. These works of art are available to take home from your child's base room, and we ask that you could collect any of your child's work by the Friday of each week.



We have very limited space available in which to store the children's work, so any work that remains uncollected each Friday will be disposed of.





Snacks & Meals

Monkfield Park Care & Learning Centre is a nut free environment and we also promote Healthy Eating.

Children who attend the pre-school are offered fresh fruit and milk or water during their sessions.

Due to the severe nature of allergies some of the children have we do not allow parents/carers to send in snacks for children during the sessions. Also we cannot accept sweets, cakes etc. on your child's birthday to share, as the children who cannot have such things become upset and may not understand why. If your child has any specific dietary requirements that you did not indicate on their admission form, please let us know.

Children who stay for lunch receive a 2 course meal which is prepared by the school kitchen; this is nutritionally balanced and meets Cambridgeshire County Council's requirements. The cost of the meal is ± 2.30 per day and the menu rotates over a three week period. You can view the menu on line at:
