### **UK Emergency Alerts Service**

On Sunday 23rd April at 3pm the government will be carrying out a national test of the UK Emergency Alerts System. At this time your mobile phone and/or tablet will make a loud siren-like sound, even if it's set on silent or vibrate. The sound and vibration will last for about 10 seconds and you will receive the following message:

This is a test of Emergency Alerts, a new UK government service that will warn you if there's a life-threatening emergency nearby.

In an actual emergency, follow the instructions in the alert to keep yourself and others safe.

This is a test. You do not need to take any action.

### **Disabling Alerts**

We have been informed that it is possible to disable the alerts on your phone or mobile device if you need to. To do this:

- Open settings and then select notifications.
- Scroll down to the bottom until you find emergency alerts.
- Turn off both extreme alerts and severe alerts.

#### **NEU Strike Action**

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Unfortunately, the National Education Union has been unable to reach an agreement with the government regarding a fully-funded, above inflation pay rise for teaching staff. Consequently, members of the NEU will be taking further strike action on Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May. In addition the NEU executive will make a further announcements in May if they will be holding three days of strike action in June and July.

Legally, members of the NEU do not have to inform their Headteacher if they are taking strike action, so it is difficult to determine the extent of the disruption the strikes will cause. We will endeavour to give parents and carers as much notice as possible if some classes do have to close and apologise in advance for the disruption this will inevitably cause.

All decisions regarding the closure of classes will be made on Health and Safety grounds as the safety and wellbeing of all our children remains our priority.

#### **School Uniform**

We have always felt hugely proud that our children look smart and well turned out in the correct school uniform. However, recently I have noticed that some of the rules around school uniform are being 'stretched' - to include a range of sports and fashion sweatshirts, leggings and training shoes. I am very aware of the financial pressures many families are experiencing at the moment, but we have always endeavoured to ensure that items of our school uniform are available at very reasonable prices from local supermarkets and online retailers and it is no longer necessary to purchase items with the school logo embroidered on them. The Friends of Monkfield Park (FOMP) have an excellent selection of second hand uniform which can be purchased for a very reasonable sum from the School Office.

Please can we remind you that our school uniform consists of:

- A bottle green school sweatshirt or school cardigan plain or with the school logo
- A white polo shirt

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- Plain grey trousers or skirt (jogging bottoms for Reception children only) not black trousers/skirts.
- For Summer a green and white check dress or grey shorts may also be worn.
- Skirt and dress lengths should be at least knee length.
- Black school shoes—not trainers, that are suitable for safe, active play.
- PE kit should consist of plain blue shorts, a plain white T shirt, plain jogging bottoms and a plain sweatshirt. Logos, slogans and decorations e.g. sequins and embroidery are not suitable for PE activities. Trainers should only be worn on the timetabled PE day.

I will be asking class teachers to check that correct uniform is being worn and will contact parents and carers if the problem persists. Please can I urge you to contact me, Mrs Major or Mrs Ray, in confidence, if you are experiencing any problems purchasing school uniform.
