

Head Lice Alert

This week we have been informed of a number of cases of head lice in school. Sadly, head lice and nits are very common in young children and their families as they spread by head-to-head contact.

We appreciate what a scourge these little beasts are once they are picked up and how frustratingly difficult it is to break the cycle and banish these unwelcome visitors. We would appreciate your co-operation in breaking the cycle by thoroughly checking your child's hair each week and treating where necessary. There is no need to buy expensive treatments, as it is just as effective to apply conditioner to wet hair and use a lice comb to remove any live lice and eggs. Please don't forget that the whole family needs to be checked at the same time and that bedding should be thoroughly washed. More information and support can be found from the NHS site on:

Staying Safe in the Sun

As the weather is beginning to get warmer the children are spending more time outside both for their learning and their break times. Please can you make sure that your child brings a named, re-fillable water bottle to school each day as it is very important that they keep hydrated. The children are able to fill their bottles from the drinking water taps in their classrooms. Squash is not allowed in water bottles as it is very damaging to children's teeth due to its acidity, high sugar content and/or artificial sweeteners.

When the weather is particularly warm and sunny it is also important that your child brings a sun hat and sun cream to school each day. We are unable to apply sun cream for your child so please apply some before coming to school in the morning and encourage your child to practise applying it themselves on exposed skin. Sun cream can contain nut oils so please can we ask that you check the ingredients before sending any creams into school as we have a number of children with severe nut allergies.
