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#### KS1 'Come and Write' Sessions

Parents of children in KS1 have been enjoying the regular Friday morning 'Come and Read' sessions for some time now. As we are always looking for ways to share more of the children's learning and the curriculum with you we have decided to trial 'Come and Write' sessions in

the usual Friday morning slot this half term. These sessions will be activity based and will include a variety of ways to support your child in writing. Please come along on Friday morning and discover your inner author with your child.

We plan to alternate the 'Come and Read' and 'Come and Write' sessions each half term.

#### **Revisiting The Great Fire of London**

This week Year 2 took a trip back in time to the bustling streets of London of 1666. The children were eager to immerse themselves in a variety of activities that were common place for Londoners in the seventeenth century. From baking bread and making perfume, to experimenting with wattle and daub, the children learnt about many of the trades which would have been carried out in Pudding Lane where the fire started. Having learnt about the construction methods used to build the infamous timber framed buildings which allowed the fire to spread so quickly, the children had great fun building their own large scale model of Pudding Lane in the Key Stage 1 courtyard. The day culminated with the children learning some dances from the period and re-enacting the events of the day the fire started.



#### In The Footsteps of Percy The Park Keeper

Children in Orange and Yellow Class have been enjoying reading the book 'After the Storm' in which Percy the Park Keeper has to find homes for his animal friends when a large oak tree is blown down. The children decided that they needed to investigate where wild animals live in Cambourne and spent the afternoon in the woods learning

about habitats. They were very excited to find nests, burrows and lots of evidence of animal activity in the trees and on the ground. The children made bark rubbings and recorded their findings in a variety of ways.







#### Sentence Starters

Ask your Reception child to find three objects and test if they blow in the wind.

Ask your Year 1 child to tell you about the differences between toys from the past and modern toys that they play with.

Ask your Year 2 child to use a blank number line to add two 2-digit numbers.

Ask your Year 3 child to tell you about 'spoof' websites.

Ask your Year 4 child how to explain how to divide a 2-digit number by 10.

Ask your Year 5 child to explain how to do the formal method of multiplication they have been learning.

Ask your Year 6 child to tell you about helpful and harmful microorganisms.
