#### COVID—19 update

We are aware that as from Monday 19th July, the government restrictions around COVID-19 are being relaxed. Due to rising numbers, for the protection of our children, staff and families, we will be keeping all of our preventative measures in place until the end of term. This is done with the full support of our Local Authority. This means that we will continue with all of the contingency arrangements that have been put into place throughout this year, such as year group pods remaining in place, staggered start and end times, as well as all of the other factors previously communicated and contained in our risk assessment (available on the school website).

We will be sending all families a letter next week to outline key changes to our processes and procedures from September, so please do look out for this.

#### Sentence Starters

#### Sending books home and end of term gifts

On Tuesday 20th July, the class teaching staff will be sending home the children's exercise books they have used this year. The art sketchbooks will go up to the next class and will therefore remain in school. We would advise that your child is supplied with their own named carrier bag so that they are able to carry their belongings more easily. We would recommend quarantining books for a period of 72 hours first. If children receive gifts from staff then we would also recommend quarantining these for 72 hours.

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#### School uniform

We know that many of you will want to get ahead in readiness for the Autumn term. Our children always look so smart and have a sense of great 'unity' when they arrive in September with the correct uniform. We would therefore like to remind you early on of the expectations for this. This will hopefully allow you plenty of time to either shop online or in local shops, so that you are able to make any necessary preparations for the start of a new academic year. Although children do not necessarily need to wear a jumper with a school logo on, you are able to choose this as an option from the online ordering service that is https://myclothing.com/. Alternatively you can find our uniform in most high street shops or larger supermarkets. It comprises of the following:

#### School uniform

-School sweatshirt or school cardigan

-White polo shirt

-Plain grey trousers or skirts (or grey jogging bottoms for Reception children)

-In the Summer, girls may wear a green and white gingham dress and boys can wear grey school uniform shorts. We request that skirt lengths should be at least knee length.

-Outdoor shoes that are suitable for safe, active play. Black shoes and <u>not</u> trainers should be worn. For safety reasons, high heels are not acceptable footwear.
