## **Horticulture in Action**

On Monday Year 1 had a visit from Kevin who is a Horticulturalist! He showed us a range of interesting and exciting plants including a 'dinner plate', 'cobra lily', 'rat tail' and a 'panda' plant. The plants really looked like their names, for example the panda plant was furry and spotty and the cobra lily looked like lots of snakes in addition to also being carnivorous! Kevin explained how plants protect themselves from being eaten by having spines, the place they grow or the shape they grow. The children looked at the structure of the plant and named the different parts.







# **Year 5 Maths Challenge**

On Thursday evening Monkfield Park hosted heat four of the Cambridge County Math's challenge. Eleven teams of the most talented Year 5 mathematicians from across the county came together to compete for a place in the grand final which will be held at Duxford Air Museum in June. Monkfield's fab four have been getting themselves into great mathematical shape over the last few weeks and they certainly gave a very convincing performance. The teams tackled some very tricky questions which involved quick thinking, great mathematical reasoning and super maths knowledge. Although we did not win the heat the children performed brilliantly as a team and won a certificate for being the best performing team in the memory round. We are all incredibly proud of their achievement.



# **Key Stage 1 Tests for Year 2 children**



Your child's teacher is responsible for judging the standards your child is working at in English, maths and science, by the end of Key Stage 1. To help inform those judgements, pupils sit national curriculum tests, commonly called SATs, in English and maths. They may also sit an optional test in English grammar, punctuation and spelling. The tests are a tool for teachers

to help them measure your child's performance and identify their needs as they move into Key Stage 2. They also allow teachers to see how your child is performing against national expected standards. The tests can be taken any time during May and they are not strictly timed. Pupils may not even know they are taking them as the teachers will incorporate them into everyday classroom activities. Teachers will use the results from these tests, along with the work your child has done throughout the year, to help them reach their own judgements about how your child is progressing at the end of Key Stage 1. These teacher assessment judgements will be reported to you by the end of the Summer term. A short video explaining the SATs process can be accessed via the following link:

### Monkfield Park Care & Learning Centre Holiday Club

Over the half-term holiday period the Care and Learning Centre holiday club will be running from 8.00 am to 6.00 pm daily. The Holiday Clubs are charged by the hour which enables parents and carers to book hours to suit their needs. The minimum chargeable unit is one hour and all sessions will be charged by the hour. Children who attend for full days or over lunchtime will also need to bring a nut-free packed lunch.

The current cost of Holiday Club sessions is £4.95 per child per hour for children aged 3 to 11 years and £5.55 per hour for children aged from 2 until the term after their third birthday. There is a £30 once-only registration fee for children who are not already registered at the Care and Learning Centre for out of school clubs.




# Summer Fete — Volunteers/Donations Needed— Saturday 23rd June—12-4pm
