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### **Enhanced Response Area**

You will all be aware that the Covid-19 infection rate is currently high in Cambridgeshire. From 1 November 2021 Cambridgeshire and Peterborough became an Enhanced Response Area (ERA). ERA status will mean more resources from government for additional measures to drive down recent rises in COVID-19 infection and to protect vulnerable people, the NHS and other vital services as the Winter months approach. Rising rates in older people, coupled with pressures building on local health and education services, led Cambridgeshire County Council and Peterborough City Council to ask the government to grant the whole area ERA status for at least five weeks from Monday 1 November. The aim is to bring down infection rates which are currently higher in most areas than seen in January's peak. Please be assured that we are continuing with the measures implemented in school earlier in October to minimise the risk of transmission and will continue to inform you of positive cases in school.

# Application for Reception Places in September 2022

Applications for Reception school places for September 2022 can now be made to the Cambridge-shire County Council Admissions Team. You can apply online at: www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/admissions or the school office will provide you with a paper copy of the form. The closing date for the first round of applications is 15th January 2022.

We appreciate that selecting the right school for your child is not an easy decision to make. Please can I encourage prospective parents to join one of our 'parent tours' so that you can see the school at first hand and we can have the opportunity to tell you what makes Monkfield Park such a special place to learn. Following advice from the Local Authority we are avoiding large gatherings to reduce the risk of transmission of Covid-19. However, we are still offering very small tours for two parents at a time and request that visitors wear face masks when in the school building. ### **Attendance**

Please can we politely remind parents and carers that if attendance falls below the national expectation of 96%, we have a legal duty to contact you to express our concerns and to offer support. Quite often parents and carers may not realise the impact that a couple of days of absence may have on their child's attendance record.

Attendance can often be improved by ensuring that appointments are taken outside of school time, that breaks are taken in the designated school holiday times, and that children are punctual. The registers close at 9.10 am, consequently, if children arrive later than 9.10 am then it is classified as an unauthorised late and therefore an absence for that session.


