Naming items

Please ensure that all items of your child's school uniform are clearly named. It makes re-uniting lost/misplaced items with their owner much easier. Thank you.

Dropping Off and Collecting Children



Following the government's latest guidance restricting social gatherings, please can we ask all parents and carers to ensure that they are maintaining social distancing of 2m, or 1m if wearing a face covering, when dropping off and collecting children from the school gates.

It is imperative that adults do not congregate at the gates so please arrive promptly for your drop off and pick up time and leave as swiftly as possible. Arriving early leads to pods mixing and causes pinch points for others trying to use the public footpaths.

BEFORE LEAVING HOME

Please check your child's temperature before they leave for school each day. If your child has a temperature above 38 degrees Celsius, a new, continuous cough or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell they must remain at home and not come to school. These are the most important symptoms of the coronavirus (Covid 19). You will need to get your child tested by calling 119 or via the Gov.uk website.

Attendance Matters

With the return to school, attendance is mandatory from the start of the Autumn term unless there are circumstances where pupils cannot attend school due to coronavirus (COVID-19) such as if they are required to self-isolate. At Monkfield Park, we know that good attendance at school leads to good academic progress. Please be reminded that a child with an attendance of less than 90% will be classed as a persistent absentee and will be monitored by the Education Welfare Officer. In these instances the Local Authority may issue a Penalty Notice. Schools must ensure that parents are informed of any attendance concerns at an early stage and therefore you should expect that you will receive an initial communication from school if your child's attendance falls below 96%. The initial letter will be to simply make you aware of your child's attendance level but if concerns persist, then the school may contact you again.

Parents who take a child out of school for term time leave for 6 consecutive sessions (3 days) or more over a 4 week period which are not authorised by the school under the exceptional circumstances rule may receive a Penalty Notice. Therefore Penalty Notices will be issued for single event absences of at least 3 consecutive school days or more where these absences are unauthorised because they are deemed to be neither exceptional or unavoidable.

Each term we analyse how each class is doing and how many children have been able to achieve that sometimes elusive 100% attendance. We know that if your child isn't in school for a very good reason, we cannot teach them all the curriculum asks them to learn and even small gaps in attendance can make a huge difference to children's understanding.

At the end of each term we celebrate those children who were able to make it in on time and every day to school. As always, our expectations for children and families are high and we look forward to a well attended year so that we are supported in doing the very best for your child/ren. Please, please adhere to the school holiday dates when visiting relatives, planning family events, appointments or holidays and don't be tempted to book when children should be learning in school. Thank you for your co-operation.

Headteacher Roll of Honour

Over the course of the year, children may be especially noticed by the Headteacher for demonstrating learning or behaviour that we feel ought to be recognised and commended. Covid -19 Myth Buster

We have been made aware of a rumour circulating on social media that suggests children in school who begin to display COVID symptoms will be taken to a government testing centre, and parents will be denied access to their child. The rumour suggests any parent arriving at the school may face being removed by the police.

THIS INFORMATION IS ENTIRELY UNTRUE.

If a child in a Cambridgeshire or Peterborough school begins to display COVID symptoms, parents will be contacted and they will be asked to take the child home and to arrange a test. This is to protect the welfare of the child and those within his/her social bubble. Ensuring the safety, welfare and protection of our children is the number one priority of each and every school in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. Our school has a clear and agreed Test and Trace process in place, backed by the Local Authority and Public Health England. This involves supporting any child who may require testing, and offering clear next steps for the family involved.

Checking Medication Held in School

If your child has an asthma inhaler, epi pen, jext-pen or other medication in school please can we ask you to contact the school office to check that their medication is still in date and is stored in a clearly named box or bag. All out of date medication will need to be taken to a pharmacy for safe disposal. Please note that we will not be able to administer out of date medication to your child.
