#### Maths

This half term we will be focusing on:

Revising all the objectives we have covered to date.

The focus on arithmetic strategies will continue to be an important part of our work as will consolidating formal written methods of calculation for all four operations.

There will be an emphasis on using and applying our mathematical knowledge in a range of multistep word problems together with work on data handling. Science After we have completed our learning about electricity we will be looking at *Light up your world*.

We will have a focus on light, developing our understanding of mirrors and the reflections they form. We will apply this knowledge to create a periscope.

# Year Six - Summer Term 1

# **North America**

English

This term we will be writing an information leaflet about North America. We will also be writing diary entries, descriptions and a short story.

We will be looking at applying grammatical rules and spelling strategies in independent writing. We will also be focusing on active reading strategies, using inference and deduction when analysing texts.

PSHE

We will develop our understanding of medical, legal recreational and illegal drugs. They will consider in more detail the effects of alcohol and cigarettes on the body and brain. Children will increase their awareness of solvents and their safe use and will begin to learn about laws relating to drugs, people who choose to use them and some reasons why.

RE

Islam Beliefs and action in the world. What key beliefs influence people's faith and how do people of faith live out their lives? Moral choices.

#### Art

We will be using the landscapes of North America as inspiration to draw and paint abstract pictures. We will explore artists John Singer Sargent and Helen Frankenthaler alongside the photographer Ansel Adams.

#### ICT

## Networks We will be asking ourselves what we already know about the internet, finding out about LAN and WAN. We will explore the 'age of the internet' as well as asking ourselves what the future might hold for internet exploration.

PE We will be exploring different invasion games within our outdoor PE lessons and practising related drills.

Athletics: We will be looking at all the aspects of a decathlon and preparing for sports day.

#### Geography

We will be exploring the geographical features of North America, such as the Rocky Mountains, Panama Canal and the Grand Canyon, alongside the human geography. We will revisit our atlas skills to locate counties in North America and research their capital cities and time zones. We will also complete a comparative study between a North American city and one here in the UK.

## KS2 SATs

Revision packs have been sent home over the Easter holidays and these are expected to be returned on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> April. SATs week will commence on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> May with the SATs breakfast available for all children in Year 6 from 8:30 Monday-Thursday. During the build up to these dates it is important that the children learn some self-care techniques in order to manage any worries or anxieties. These could include: calming breathing, mindfulness colouring, spending time outside in a natural environment, making and listening to a calming playlist.
