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In School This Week—Head Lice!

This week we have been informed of a number of cases of head lice in school.

As a mum, I appreciate what a scourge they are and how frustratingly difficult it is to break the cycle and banish these unwelcome visitors. We would appreciate your co-operation in managing this by thoroughly checking your child's hair each week and treating where necessary. There is no need to buy expensive treatments, as it is just as effective to apply conditioner to wet hair and use a lice comb to remove any live lice and eggs.

Attendance Updates

Last week we sent out attendance letters to inform parents and carers if their child's attendance had fallen below 96%.

Schools have a statutory duty to monitor attendance and every month we analyse the attendance data for each child. The percentage attendance figure is calculated for the school year to the end of the previous month i.e. for this year to date, this will be from 5th September 2024. Schools are required to ensure that parents are informed of any attendance concerns at the earliest opportunity, therefore you will receive an initial communication from us if your child's attendance falls below 96%. This initial letter will be to simply make you aware of your child's attendance level.

If concerns persist and your child's attendance continues to deteriorate then the school will contact you again to inform you of our concerns and to offer a supportive meeting with Mrs Walsh, our Family Support Worker, to explore the reasons for the absences and discuss what help can be put in place to increase attendance. This is a voluntary and supportive process and Mrs Walsh is on the playground every morning to help if your child is feeling anxious about coming into school.

If a child's attendance falls below 90% they will be classified as a persistent absentee. Schools are legally obliged to provide support and intervention for pupils which will take the form of school-based interventions, and the offer of support from outside agencies and professionals. As a school we are very keen to identify the barriers to attendance that families face and will welcome opportunities to support you and overcome these barriers together.

Year 6 Netball Tournament

Well done to our Year 6 netball teams who participated in the first netball tournament of the season at Cambourne Village college this week. Mr Yates reported that the children played with great passion and determination, demonstrating excellent team skills. Both teams had a very enjoyable time and were great ambassadors for our school.



Year 5 Looking To the Future

It's never too early to start thinking about the future so, with this in mind, Year 5 visited the Careers Fair organised by the Network CB23 cluster of schools. This was an excellent opportunity for the children to meet representatives from a range of local companies. The children were able to talk to many different employers including the NHS, the Wildlife Trust, Cambridge University, Citrix Systems and Savills Estate Agents. All the exhibitors chatted to the children so that they were able to gain an understanding of what their jobs entail, the different roles available and the skills that are needed for a variety of inspirational and motivating careers.



Year 1 Visit to Castle Hedingham

We love to enrich the children's learning with hands on experiences and as Year 1 are currently immersing themselves in studying medieval castles we jumped at the opportunity to visit Hedingham Castle. Castle Hedingham is one of the best-preserved Norman keeps in England and an amazing place for children to visit and explore. This was a fantastic experience for the children as they were able to witness what life was like for the people who lived at Castle Hedingham 900 years ago.
