# Healthy Eating Recipe—Baba ganoush

Ingredients

3 aubergines

- 3 garlic cloves, crushed with a teaspoon of salt
- 1 lemon, juice only
- 2 tablespoons tahini
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- black pepper, to taste 1 tablespoon chopped flat leaf parsley Method

Prick the aubergines with a fork and grill until the skin is blackened and the flesh feels soft when you press it.

Crush the garlic with the lemon juice, tahini, olive oil and pepper.

Cut the aubergines in half and scoop out the flesh. Mix the soft flesh with the remaining ingredients.

# The voice of the child project

The Education Child Protection Service together with the LSCB (Local



Safeguarding Children Board) ran a project at the beginning of the Summer term 2017 to capture the views of primary aged children about perceptions of safety and to promote talking to a trusted adult if they are feeling worried.

Teachers across the school used lesson plans and materials which were also provided to address this topic with their clas-



ses. Lessons and activities included exploring the early warning signs that indicate when we do not feel safe and developing strategies individuals can draw on if they are feeling worried, bullied, stressed or in abusive situations.

There was also the opportunity for pupils to participate in a competition to promote personal safety, either in film or poster form. The winning film recording and posters will then be shared with schools for use as a future assembly resource and the winning film and posters will be displayed on the LSCB website.

Two winning posters were chosen from Monkfield Park and were Annabelle (Yellow Class) and Maya (Violet Class).

## Wood Green visit Year 4

This week, the children in Year 4 were visited by a member of staff from Wood Green. During an assembly, the children learnt about different animals and how to care for them, followed by a workshop focussed on caring for rabbits.
