Attendance Monitoring

This week we will be sending out attendance letters to inform parents and carers if their child's attendance had fallen below 96% in this academic year.

Every month we analyse the attendance data for each child. The percentage attendance figure is calculated for the school year to the end of the previous month i.e. for this year this will be from 4th September 2023. Schools are required to ensure that parents are informed of any attendance concerns at an early stage and therefore you will receive an initial communication from us if your child's attendance falls below 96%.

This initial letter will be to simply make you aware of your child's attendance level. If concerns persist, then the school will contact you again to inform you of their concerns. Following the initial letter, if your child's attendance level continues to fall we will contact you and can arrange a meeting with you to explore the reasons and discuss what help can be put in place to increase attendance.

The government now classes persistent absenteeism as 10%, which means that any child with an attendance of less than 90% will be classed as a persistent absentee and will be monitored by our Local Authority Attendance Improvement Officer. In these instances the Local Authority may issue a Penalty Notice.

Please note that we are unable to authorise holidays or extended periods of leave during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Competitive Pumpkins

Our Reception children marked Halloween by holding a competition to design a pumpkin lantern. Mrs Howell had the very difficult job of choosing a winner, but after much deliberation Reuben and Max were declared the winners for their spooky design. The children then enjoyed carving the winning design into a pumpkin and rounded off the day with roasting and tasting the pumpkin.



Applying for a School Place

If your child was born between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020, and you live in Cambridgeshire you need to apply for a Reception place for September 2024.

Welcome to the Stone Age

The children in Year 3 embarked on a prehistoric journey to discover what life was like for people living during the Stone Age.
