Woolsthorpe Manor is the birth place of Sir Isaac Newton, whom the children have been learning about this half term. They already had such a breadth of knowledge about him that even the guides were impressed! Throughout the day they made links with their prior knowledge and Isaac Newton's scientific discoveries by testing gravity when launching handmade rockets, experiencing the forces of push and pull in the science centre, and seeing Isaac's bedroom where he first questioned the spectrum of light and built a model of the reflective telescope. Lillie-May in Violet Class—Lillie-May tries so hard in all that she does. She applies herself in all aspects of her work and we are incredibly proud of her.


Florence in Orange Class—Florence shows so much enthusiasm about her learning. Her enthusiasm is absolutely contagious and inspires us all.
