Additionally, children will be reminded that they should not include trading or swapping cards and we would appreciate your support in monitoring this. Please see an extract from the original letter sent out to families in the Autumn term, which is a reminder about what types of restrictions we have put upon the toys to ensure the safety and enjoyment of all of the children.

The toy must be pocket sized i.e. able to fit into a coat pocket or trouser pocket.

The toy must not be dangerous or offensive e.g. sharp.

The toy must not be a trading or swapping card game.

The toy must not be used to hurt another child.

Your child must return the toy to their tray at the end of playtime/ lunchtime. It is not allowed to be used during classroom/learning time.

The school cannot take responsibility for any toy lost or damaged. The toy your child brings into school is at their own risk.

Even though they are growing, it's important to make sure children get just the right amount of food for their age—not too little and not too much. So here are a few tips to ensure that your child is



getting the right sized portions.

- Remember that children are smaller than adults. It sounds obvious, but an adult tummy is much bigger than a child's tummy—so try and give them a portion that matches their size and not the same amount of food as you.
 - It's also healthier to give a smaller portion to begin with, then let them ask for more if they're still hungry.
 - Watch packaging sizes. Lots of food and drinks are designed for adults or for sharing.

Monkfield Park Care & Learning Centre Holiday Club

The Care & Learning Centre operates a Holiday Club during school holiday periods.

Holiday Club sessions are charged by the hour from 8.00 am until 6.00 pm daily which enables parents/carers to book hours to suit their needs (the minimum chargeable unit is one hour).

Breakfast is available from 8.00 am until 10.00 am daily. Children arriving between these times independently choose activities to participate in. The children eat together between midday and 1.00 pm and an afternoon snack is served between 3.00 pm and 3.30 pm.

Children attending for full days or over lunchtime will need to bring a nut-free packed lunch. Also, we cannot heat or re-heat items sent in from home.

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The current cost of Holiday Club is £4.70 per child per hour for children aged 3 to 11 years and £5.25 per hour for children aged from 2 until the term after their third birthday (a one-off registration fee of £30.00 applies to register a child at the Care & Learning Centre).
