# Communication and Language

We will be: Verbally making up rhyming word strings when making word potions; Following instructions to complete superhero missions; Choosing words to describe and compare objects e.g. a slimy spider; Working with our friends to make up stories using words, actions and props.

# Personal, Social and Emotional

#### We will be:

Discussing kind and unkind behaviour when learning about witches and wizards; Working in teams to build superhero machines and gadgets; Celebrating each other's successes through superhero missions and challenges; Taking turns when playing party games at the Christmas party.

# Physical Development

We will be:

Using the gym equipment to move and travel in different ways to represent witches, wizards and heroes e.g. performing forward rolls on the gym mats; Visiting the park to practise superhero moves;

Developing cutting skills further e.g. by cutting out snowflakes.

#### Literacy

We will be: Writing CVC word potions; Sequencing familiar stories e.g. Room on the Broom; Writing simple wizard spells e.g. two or three word instructions; Designing superhero names; Creating and re-telling our own superhero stories; Sending Christmas lists to Father Christmas.

# Understanding of the World

We will be: Experimenting with light and dark; Learning and performing magic tricks; Exploring magnetism; Exploring the speed of different objects; Learning about and retelling the Christmas Story; Comparing how Christmas is celebrated around the world. Witches, Wizards

and Heroes

# <u>Mathematics</u>

We will be: Recognising and ordering numbers from 1 to 20;

Adding together two amounts to make a new total;

Measuring and comparing capacities whilst making potions;

Measuring time in simple ways e.g. using sand timers to complete super hero missions; Recognising and naming 3D shapes whilst investigating Christmas.

#### Expressive Art and Design

We will be:

Mixing different media together to make a magical texture;

Using different instruments to make spooky music; Re-enacting and making our own versions of witches and wizard stories;

Designing superhero capes;

Making mini superheroes finger puppets; Designing and making our own wrapping paper.

Can you believe that the children have completed their first half term at school? We hope that you feel it has been as successful and rewarding for your child as we do. We are looking forward to another fun-filled and busy half term ahead. Our topic focus for the second half of the Autumn term is 'Witches, Wizards and Heroes' which will be full of surprises and all things magical. ## Contributing to your child's Learning Journey

Please continue to contribute to your child's learning journey through the use of the magical moment slips and by providing any photographs or work from home. Do not forget that photographs can be sent to the school office with a click of a button on your phone! If you have signed up for 'Parent Share', then this will also allow you to view observations made in school electronically and comment on these. The first Come and Share session will take place on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> November where you will have the opportunity to share your child's Learning Journey with them.

## Helping your child at home

- Recognising and ordering the numbers 1-10/1-20 e.g. using sticky notes or magnetic numbers.
- Finding one more or one less than a given number and comparing amounts e.g. using grapes or pasta.
- Recognising the initial sound in words and blending/reading three letter cvc words.
- Writing labels for models or drawings.
- Making observations of the changing weather e.g. the frost on the grass in the morning.

- Encouraging your child to make up their own stories to support their play e.g. pretending to be a chef when helping you in the kitchen.

Please note that we also suggest fun and simple activities for home learning via the Reception weekly news which is displayed on the notice board outside the classrooms and also uploaded onto the website.
