What is the MTC?

The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for all year 4 pupils registered at schools in England.

Why?

The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It helps schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided.

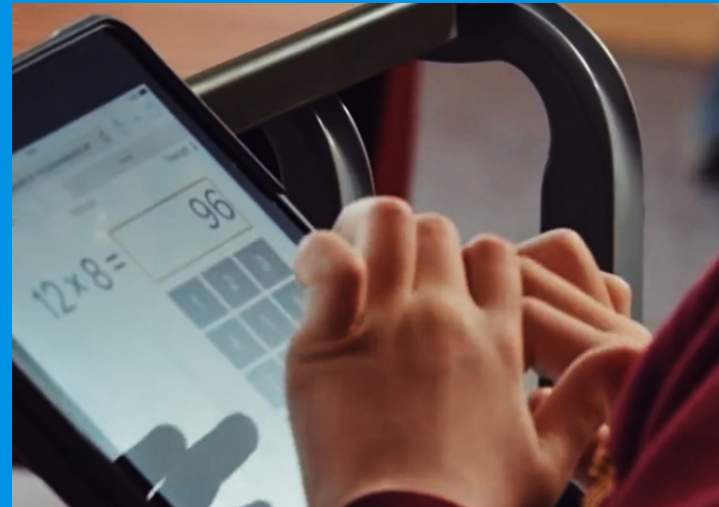
When?

In 2025, schools must administer the MTC to all year 4 pupils between Monday 2 June and Friday 13 June.

Schools can use the following week; Monday 16 June to Friday 20 June, to administer the check to any pupils who were absent during the first 2 weeks or in case of any delays to the administration of the check due to technical difficulties.

How?

- Small focus groups,
- iPads or a desktop PC (depending on which they have been most confident using during practices.
- 25 questions.
- 6 seconds per question.
- Results will be shared via your child's teacher.

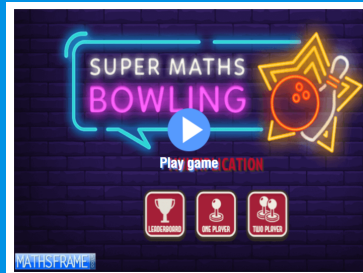

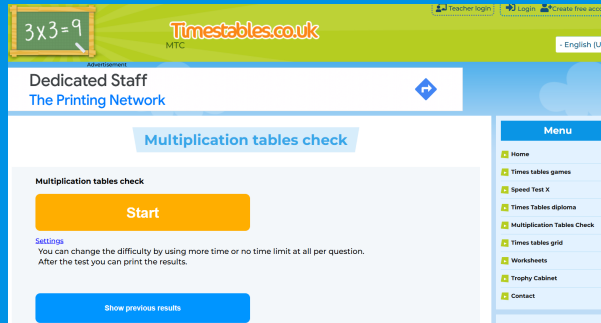
