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Dolce has informed us that due to increases in the National Living Wage and the cost of food inflation the price of school meals will be increasing from 1st April 2023. The cost of a school lunch will increase from £2.35 per day to £2.55.

All children in Reception and Key Stage 1 will continue to re-

ceive Universal Infant Free School Meals.

In addition, Dolce have experienced a high volume of uncollected debt. Currently a pupil's account is allowed to fall into debt by 5 meals. To reduce the risk in increasing unpaid debt, Dolce will be reducing this to 3 meals from 1st April.

These increases still represent good value and, as you have seen in recent newsletters, the quality of the meals provided is excellent and are tailored to the children's tastes.

Across the Care and Learning Centre, children have been busy mark making this week. In the Hedgehog Room, the younger children have been experimenting with a variety of media such as pens, pencils, crayons, chalks and paint dabbers. They have drawn individual pictures, as well as working together to mark make on big rolls of paper.

In the Rabbit Group, the children have each been introduced to their own individual name writing cards. We have talked about how each name has a 'big letter' at the beginning called a 'capital letter', and how all the letters have a 'special way' to write them. The children have been really keen to start using their cards to practise name writing and to help them write their names onto their pictures.

Next week, Rabbit Group will be bringing home a copy of their writing name card to practise with at home, along with a letter containing tips for parents and carers on supporting early writing skills.
