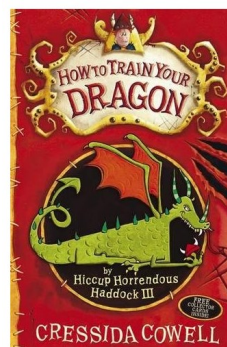

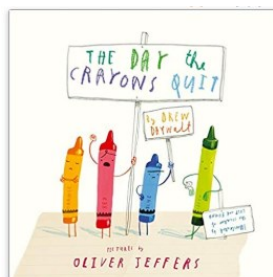


Key Stage 1—The day the crayons quit by Oliver Jeffers
