Street Tag

On Monday I spoke to the children about an exciting new initiative that is running in Cambridgeshire from 7th July to 1st September, called Street Tag.

Street Tag is a free app where you earn points by collecting virtual tags when you walk, run, cycle, roll or scoot past them. Street Tag encourages families to become more physically active which boosts mental health. When you sign up to the Schools Leader board, the points you collect will be added to the total score for your school, and schools with the most points win prizes of sports and play equipment for their school.

There are virtual tags all-around Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, including parks, adventure playgrounds and libraries. Once you are within a 40-metre radius of any virtual tag, your app will automatically collect the points, steps can also be synced and converted into Street Tag points. Head Lice

This week we have been informed of a further cases of head lice in school. Sadly, head lice and nits are very common in young children and their families as they spread by head-to-head contact.

We appreciate what a scourge these little beasts are once they are picked up and how frustratingly difficult it is to break the cycle and banish these unwelcome visitors. We would appreciate your co-operation

in breaking the cycle by thoroughly checking your child's hair each week and treating where necessary. There is no need to buy expensive treatments, as it is just as effective to apply conditioner to wet hair and use a lice comb to remove any live lice and eggs. Please don't forget that the whole family needs to be checked at the same time and that bedding should be thoroughly washed. More information and support can be found from the NHS site on:

This week in our Group Time sessions, we have been learning about symmetry. We looked at some pictures of different butterflies and noticed how the colours and patterns on each wing were the same. During their play, the children then had a go at using different coloured shapes to create their own symmetrical butterflies.





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Fred Talk

The children in the Rabbit Group have also started learning to speak in Fred Talk this week! Fred is a toy frog from the Read Write Inc phonics scheme who comes to join us for our phonics sessions. Fred doesn't speak like us! Fred splits up the sounds in words and then puts them back together again.
