We then went on to look at helpful pathogens and how leaf cutter ants were revolutionising antibiotics.



Using the science as inspiration, we created poems and artwork on bacteria. We enjoyed expressing ourselves using Brusho, bubble wrap and oil pastels. This has given us an insight into the world of science, art and writing and inspired many of us to follow in their footsteps – we have even been able to create our own investigations and wait in anticipation to watch the bacteria grow!
