Thank you to those who responded to our recent consultation about the morning arrangements. I can now confirm that an overwhelming majority of parents would like children to come directly into the classroom each morning at 8.50 am, with 10% preferring teachers collecting from the playground, 89% preferring direct entry to the classroom, and 1% having no view. In light of this result, as from next Monday 10th July, we will permanently welcome children directly into classrooms at 8.50 am each morning. # Healthy Lifestyles Week—Energise and empower!



# Pocket toys reminder

As from September 2016, we allowed children to bring in 'pocket toys' to play with during break times. Of late we have noticed that a few toys being brought into school have not been appropriate. Please remember the following information regarding pocket toys in school. In the event that this information is not adhered to, please be aware that the pocket toy may be held in the class teacher's cupboard until the end of the school day:

-The toy must be pocket sized i.e. able to fit into a coat pocket or trouser pocket.

- -The toy must not be dangerous or offensive e.g. sharp.
- -The toy must not be a trading or swapping card game.
- -The toy must not be used to hurt another child.
- -Your child must return the toy to their tray at the end of playtime/lunchtime. It is not allowed to be used during classroom/learning time.

#### Monkfield Park holiday club

The Care & Learning Summer Holiday Club will be open from 8.00 am until 6.00 pm on weekdays from Monday 24<sup>th</sup> July to Friday 1<sup>st</sup> September 2017.

Sessions are booked and charged by the hour which enables parents/carers to book hours to suit their needs (a one-off registration fee is payable for children who are not already registered at the Care & Learning Centre). Each day has a theme where planned activities take place at various points during the day. A selection of alternative activities are available during each session and at the times specific activities aren't taking place. #### Healthy Eating Recipe—Cauliflower Risotto (Serves 4)

#### Topping:

Ingredients: 100g stale bread, 50g anchovies, 3 red chillies.

1. Blend all of the above ingredients together and bake until crispy.

#### <u>Risotto:</u>

Ingredients: 1 cauliflower, 400g Arborio Rice, 1 onion, 1 litre vegetable stock, 1 garlic clove, 50ml olive oil

- 1. Chop middle part of cauliflower and cook with the onion and garlic
- 2. Sweat the onion and garlic in the olive oil
- 3. Add the rice and stir until coated
- 4. Put in the cauliflower in small florets
- 5. Add in the stock a small ladleful at a time, stirring until each is absorbed
- 6. Serve and garnish with chopped parsley
