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## Greater Cambridgeshire Local Plan

This week the Youth Engagement Service ran some workshops for the children in Years 5 and 6 on the draft Greater Cambridge Plan. With the proposed expansion of Cambourne around the new railway station, the planners are keen to know what children value most so that they can prioritise resources. The children made some very valid points about biodiversity and green spaces, wellbeing and social inclusion, homes, jobs and the infrastructure they feel will be needed as Cambourne develops and grows. The team was very complimentary and praised the children for their creativity, their ideas and the eloquent way they presented their views. The data generated from the workshop will be analysed and the results will be fed back to the Planning Policy Team as part of the consultation process, ensuring that the children's input is acknowledged in the planning policy document. It is pleasing to know that the children will have their say in the future of their town and community. As one of the children commented; "I hope this means we will actually get a swimming pool in Cambourne now".

There is still a possibility that the team could make it to the finals if they are the highest scoring runners up. We are keeping everything crossed for them as they certainly deserve it.

Ask your Year 1 child to tell you about the different parts of a letter.


Show your Year 2 child different coins or notes and ask them to tell you their values.

## A Polite Reminder About Parking!



We appreciate that the public car park in Priory Walk can be very busy at peak times but we have continued to received a number of complaints about inconsiderate car parking! We have also noticed cars parking on the grass verge adjacent to the staff car park gates and parents blocking the gates when dropping off or collecting their children.

The Highway Code states that parking is prohibited on double yellow lines and yellow zig-zag lines outside schools **at all times**; this includes

stopping to set down or pick up passengers. Although the verge is not on school property we would request that parents and carers do not put our children in danger by stopping or parking in this area as it increases the likelihood of an accident.



