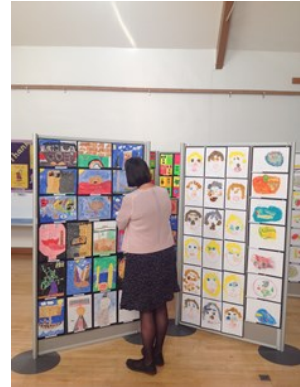

Year 5 'Wow' Greek Day

On Friday the children in Year 5 experienced the first of our 'Wow' History days for this academic year. Their topic this term is the Ancient Greeks and so it was with great excitement that they all donned their chitons and girdles and stepped into Miss Simpson's time machine to be transported back more than 2,000 years to the time when Athens and Sparta vied to become the dominant power in the Mediterranean.



The children were totally immersed in Ancient Greek culture with a wide variety of hands-on arts and craft experiences, which included making decorative vases and mosaic panels to adorn their houses. In the afternoon they experienced the excitement of visiting a Greek theatre and rounded off the day with an authentic Greek banquet. Everyone involved thoroughly enjoyed the day and learnt so much. The children are now looking forward to finding out more in the exciting lessons their teachers have planned for them.



Please Remember Your PE Kit

PE lessons are a compulsory part of the curriculum for all year groups, so please ensure that your child has everything that they require for these lessons and that all kit is named. PE kit consists of the following....

Indoor kit: plain white T-shirt, blue shorts, socks, plimsolls.

Outdoor kit: sensible trainers, socks, tracksuit or jogging bottoms and a jumper/sweatshirt for cold weather.

Children in KS2 may also wear football boots (without metal studs) for playing football.

All children should have taken home their Reading Records this week. Inside you will now find a list of recommended reads that the children should aim to complete before the end of the academic year. It might be a nice idea to add a couple of these books to your child's birthday or Christmas present list! Once you have read the book to your child or your child has read it themselves, simply tick the box and write a comment in the Reading Record.
