#### **A Few Polite Reminders**

**Wellingtons.** Although we have been enjoying the sunny weather for a number of weeks we have also had some rain showers this week which has led to the field becoming muddy again. Please can we ask you to remind your child to bring their boots/spare shoes back to school to help us to control the amount of mud that is being trampled into the carpets. The boots/spare shoes should be stored in the green storage cabinets outside each classroom.

**Jewellery**. For health and safety reasons jewellery and elaborate hair ornaments should not be worn to school. The only exceptions are watches and small studs for pierced ears—hoop earrings are not allowed to be worn in school. All jewellery items, including 'fitbits', MUST be removed during PE lessons and hair must be tied back to prevent injury. Children should remove their own earrings and store them safely or parents should remove them before the start of the school day.

**Naming uniform.** We have a growing collection of discarded sweatshirts which are not named. Please can you ensure that all items of school uniform and equipment are clearly named. This does not have to be a sewn in name tape but can simply be your child's name written in pen on the label. It makes it almost impossible to reunite lost/misplaced items with their owners without this.

#### Year 4 Visit to India

This week, Year 4 embarked on an incredible adventure, traveling by Air Aquila to spend the day in India. Whilst in India they made coconut Ladous - which one of the children described as "the best thing I have ever tasted". The children went on to print beautiful mandala patterns onto fabric, designed henna hand patterns, created clay divas, dressed up in traditional Indian costumes, danced bhangra style and played Kancha, a popular Indian game with marbles. They all had a fabulous day and are excited to learn more about Indian Culture in the coming weeks.
