Snapchat and Snap Maps

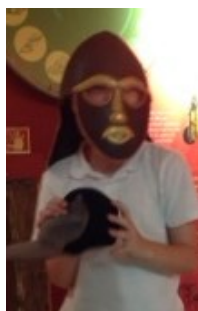
The introduction of the location based map on the app Snapchat has caused a lot of concern. The Snap Map shows a user's Bitmoji (their cartoon avatar), on a map and then you can zoom in to see their exact location. This clearly has implications for children and young people if they are to be found and tracked in this way by those who may wish to offend against them.

Childnet has published information about Snap Maps, top tips on keeping safe, and instructions on how to change the settings to ensure any risk is minimised. The best tip is to use ghost mode which means that the individual themselves is the only person who can see the location.

Year 3 visit West Stowe



Year 3 thoroughly enjoyed our trip to the Anglo Saxon Village in West Stow. We got to explore the Anglo Saxon houses and discover what each one was used for within the Village. We found out why different designs of houses were thought to have existed and discussed the uses of each one by going inside and investigating like real anthropologists.

We then explored the museum and got to see real Anglo Saxon artefacts that had been discovered at West Stow, as well as trying on and handling replica objects such as clothes, helmets, pottery and arrow heads. We learnt that the Anglo Saxons took great pride in their appearance and the ones that lived at West Stow were thought to have traded combs and pottery for other precious items like glass beads and iron.

It was a fantastic way to end our topic on the Anglo Saxons and bring all of the facts that we had already learnt to life.

Healthy Eating Recipe—Spiced butternut soup

Ingredients:

- 2 tablespoons of olive oil
- 2 onions, finely chopped
- 2 dessert apples, peeled and finely chopped
- 3 celery sticks, finely chopped
- ½ small butternut squash, chopped into small pieces
- 2-3 heaped tablespoons of curry powder
- 1 tablespoon of ground cinnamon
- 2 x 400g cans chopped tomatoes
- 1½ litre of chicken or vegetable stock
- 140g basmati rice
- small bunch parsley, chopped
- 3 tablespoons of mango chutney
- natural yoghurt, to serve

Method:

1. Heat the oil in a large saucepan. Add the onions, apples and celery. Cook for 10 mins, stirring occasionally, until softened. Add the butternut squash, curry powder, cinnamon. Cook for 2 mins more, then stir in the tomatoes and stock. Cover with a lid and simmer for 15 mins.
2. Stir in the rice, pop the lid back on and simmer for another 12 mins until the rice is cooked through. Taste and add seasoning if needed. Stir through the parsley and mango chutney, then serve in bowls with yoghurt and extra mango chutney on top, if you like.
