# Monkfield Park Care & Learning Centre Holiday Club

The Care & Learning Centre operates a Holiday Club during school holiday periods. Holiday Club sessions are charged by the hour from 8.00 am until 6.00 pm daily which enables parents/carers to book hours to suit their needs (the minimum chargeable unit is one hour). Children attending for full days or over lunchtime will need to bring a nut-free packed lunch. Also, we cannot heat or re-heat items sent in from home.

The cost of the Holiday Club will be £4.80 per child per hour for children aged 3 to 11 years and £5.25 per hour for children aged from 2 until the term after their third birthday (a one-off registration fee applies to register a child at the Care & Learning Centre). 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### **Healthy Eating recipes**

As part of our commitment to promoting healthy lifestyles and to follow on from our healthy lifestyle tips in recent newsletter articles, we have decided to provide you with some simple, healthy recipes which all of the family can get involved in making and trying. The first is a recipe for butterbean hummus which is simple, tasty and healthy.

### Butterbean 'hummus'

200g butterbeans

Lemon juice

2 cloves garlic

1 teaspoon cumin

Salt

2 tablespoon tahini

4 tablespoon water

2 tablespoon olive oil

Blend all ingredients in food processor



# Parents - make a difference!

Healthwatch Cambridgeshire, which works to improve children's health and wellbeing, is looking for parents to join its advisory group. The group will be involved in the `DEAL Study'. DEAL stands for Developing Early identification and Access in Learning Environments, and the focus of the study is on finding out about the best ways that schools can spot early signs of children's emotional health difficulties.

Cambridge University is seeking the assistance of schools to recruit parents of primary school aged children to be part of its advisory group, which will help guide how the study is run. Parents will not need to know anything about research, how schools work, or emotional health and well-being, to be part of the advisory group; their experience as a parent will help the researchers in the work they are doing.

The role will involve coming to advisory group meetings to give ideas, feedback and advice to make sure the project is going in the right direction.

Participation would involve coming to as many of the meetings as possible. These will be held every four months, at an accessible venue.

Meetings usually last less than 1.5 hours.

Participants will receive a £10 shopping voucher for each meeting they attend as a token of appreciation for their time.

Refreshments will be served at each meeting.

Out of pocket travel expenses will be reimbursed on the day.
