Half-Term Break Test and Trace

School will be fully closed over the February half term holiday period as we are not expected to remain open for vulnerable children and the children of critical workers during that week.

However, we are still expected to carry out contact tracing if we are informed of a positive Covid –19 test in the 48 hours after school closes on Friday 12th February.

If your child tests positive for Covid-19 within the 48 hour period after the half term break commences, we would ask you to follow the NHS Covid-19 guidelines and notify us by e-mailing the school office on: office@monkfieldpark.cambs.sch.uk so that we are able to assist with contact tracing over this period.

From Monday 15th February you should notify NHS test and trace if your child tests positive.
