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Anti-Bullying Week

I am often asked if bullying happens at Monkfield Park. I have to be truthful and explain that sadly it does as when over 400 children are together some bullying is inevitable. However, it is what we do about bullying when we are informed about it that is really important. As a school we have a zero tolerance approach to bullying and part of that approach is to ensure that we raise awareness of bullying in school and elsewhere, and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it.

Next week is National Anti-Bullying Week when we will be 'Making A Noise About Bullying'. The theme this year aims to empower children to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes. The children will be taking part in a range of activities and workshops across the week linked to the theme which will help them to reflect on bullying behaviours and what we can all do to stamp out bullying and keep all children safe.

Year 6 Visit to Duxford

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On Wednesday Year 6 visited the Imperial War Museum at Duxford to carry out some hands-on research about the First World War. In school, the children have been learning about the causes of the First World War and what life was like for soldiers in the trenches. At Duxford they were able to see so many original vehicles from WWI including the red London buses used to transport troops to the Western Front and some of the earliest planes and tanks which were employed in battle.
