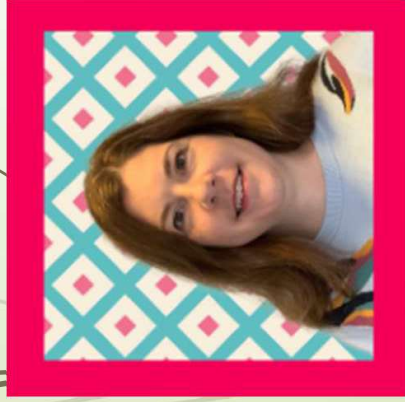

What happens in Year 6?

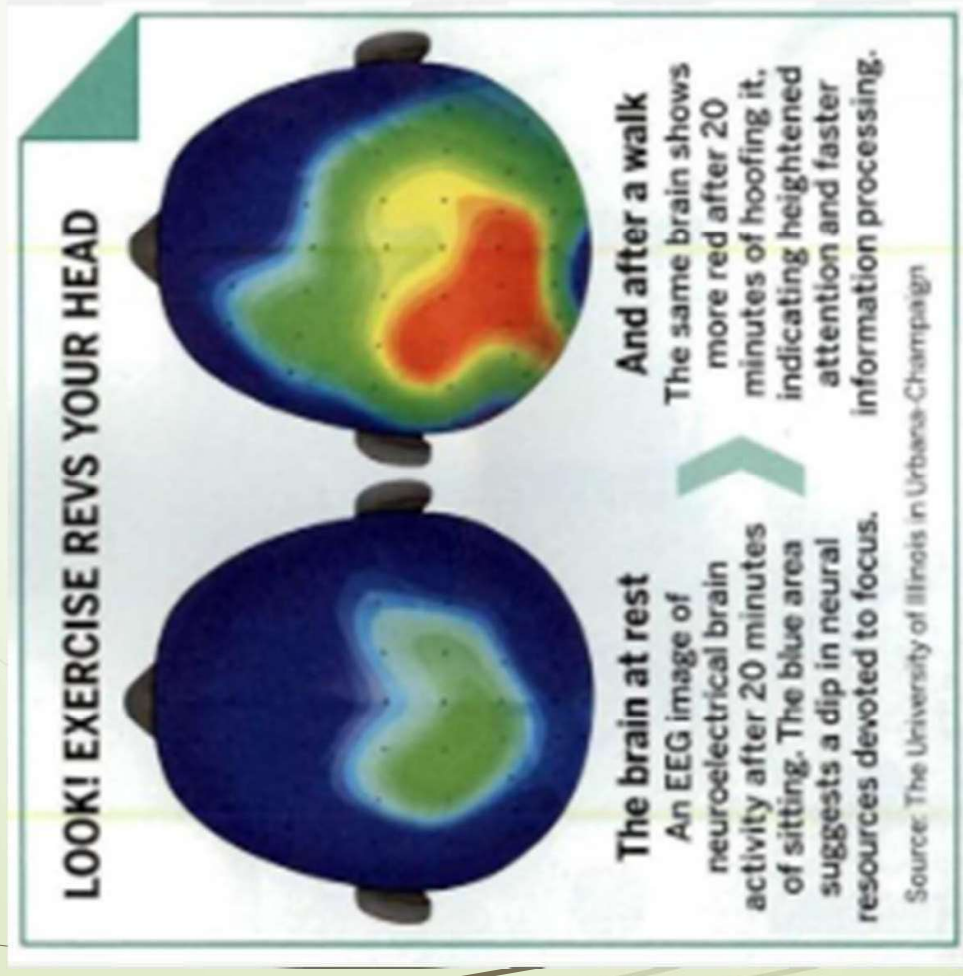
Being the last year at primary school it is very much a transition year, in preparation for the move to secondary school. Some of the highlights:

Expectations in Year 6

- Being organised (belongings and work).
- Setting an example for the rest of the school (correct uniform including black school shoes, no jewellery or make-up, sensible hair styles).
- Being independent and taking the initiative.
- Jobs that support the smooth running of the school day.
- Growing sense of maturity.

Active learning



- ▶ Daily 10 minute walk/jog/run.
- ▶ Regular movement breaks.
- ▶ Taking learning outside more.
- ▶ Light exercise before SATs papers.

Online safety

- ▶ We will be teaching the children how to stay safe online, using a variety of different materials.
- ▶ The school has a secure firewall to enable all children to search as safely as possible.
- ▶ Class Dojo enables work to be shared between teacher and pupil. No one else is able to access or view your child's work.
- ▶ Purple Mash and Times Tables Rockstars (TTRS) are both designed to ensure safety online. Children must make sure they keep their passwords secure.
- ▶ We discuss the use of AI regularly and ensure that children understand the dangers of feeding personal information into it.
- ▶ Children must sign the home-school agreement to use the internet at school.

Transition to secondary school

- Applications close 31st October 2026.

SATS

- Mornings of the week beginning 10th May 2027
- Children are tested in:
 - English: reading comprehension
 - English: grammar, punctuation and spelling
 - Maths (2 reasoning papers and an arithmetic paper)
- Writing will be continually assessed throughout the year. In May we submit our teacher judgements.
- Children will be well prepared for their tests. If you feel you want to do any at home, please use pre 2020 papers.



SATS

- Children will be given 'scaled scores'.
- You will be given your child's raw score (the actual number of marks they get), alongside their scaled score.
- A scaled score of 100 will be judged to have met the "National Standard".
- A scaled score of 110 or above will be judged to be working at the "Higher Standard".
- We will convert the practice paper results to scaled scores to help track the children's progress.
